

The Message of Easter.

Pope Francis has said "At Easter time the Church throughout the world echoes the angel's message to the women: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised...... Come, see the place where he lay" (Mt. 28:5-6).

This is the culmination of the Gospel, it is the Good News: Jesus, who was crucified, is risen! This event is the basis of our faith and our hope. Christ is risen! It is the foundation of Christianity. If Christ had not risen, Christianity would lose its very meaning.

The message which Christians bring to the world is this: Jesus Love incarnate, died on the cross for our sins, but God the Father raised him and made him the Lord of life and death. In Jesus, love has triumphed over hatred, mercy over sinfulness, goodness over evil, truth over falsehood, life over death.

That is why we tell everyone: "Come and see" the Good News is no mere matter of words, but a testimony to unconditional and faithful love: It is about leaving ourselves behind and helping others, being close to those crushed by life's troubles, sharing with the needy, standing at the side of the sick, elderly and the outcast...

"Come and see!" Love is more powerful, love gives life, love makes hope blossom in the wilderness.

With this joyful certainty in our hearts, today we turn to you risen Lord, we pray for all the people on this earth; you who have conquered death, grant us your life, grant us your peace!
