NOTE FROM PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE TAX REFUND.



Under the Charitable Donation Scheme our parish may claim a refund of tax paid on your donations. In 2017 and 2018, the Parish received €6,797 and €8,896 respectively through this scheme. For the Parish to receive the refund on your donation, you must:

- 1 Be an income tax payer.
- **2** Make your donation either through the envelope system or by Standing Order.
- 3 Donate a minimum of €250.00 per year.
- 4 Give consent to the Parish to claim the refund on your behalf.

The Parish cannot claim any tax rebate on donations made outside the envelope system or by standing order, as there will be no record of who makes these donations.

Diocesan Levy

At the end of every year, our Parish has to donate funds to the diocese, i.e. the Diocesan Levy. In 2017 and 2018, our Parish donated €44,540 and €45,050 respectively to this fund.

There is a common misconception among parishioners that all monies received in the envelopes goes to the Diocese. This is not correct. The Diocesan Levy is paid from the total income received.
