

## <u>'AMORIS LAETITIA' – 'THE JOY OF LOVE'</u> <u>POPE FRANCIS</u>

'Amoris Laetitia' was published on April 8<sup>th</sup> 2016. It was signed on March 19<sup>th</sup> the feast day of Saint Joseph, who is seen as being the protector of the family. The theme of this letter is love in the family. It is Pope Francis' own reflections on two recent Synods on Marriage and the Family held in 2014 and 2015.

Many of us had the opportunity for the first time, to contribute to those Synods, through the submissions we made personally or as Parish groups, so the questions discussed in the letter are, in a very real sense, our questions. Pope Francis affirms church teaching on family life and marriage, how the Church can equip couples to embrace God's vision for marriage, and can offer healing for families who are struggling. "The same mercy and patience that are essential for building a strong family must be shown to those whose families are in trouble, or have broken up" the Pope tells us. He urges the Church to appreciate the context of people's lives when helping them make good decisions. Pope Francis uses the word "tenderness" to describe family life- "a closeness that is conscious and not simply biological". Pope Francis says: "No family drops down from heaven perfectly formed, families need constantly to grow and mature in the ability to love.., and he strongly emphasizes the role of personal conscience and pastoral discernment in this compassionate document that will offer comfort and guidance to all Christian families struggling with both the spiritual and economic challenges of our contemporary world. He urges us to make this journey as families, "let us keep walking together (...) May we never lose heart because of our limitations, or ever stop seeking that fullness of love and communion which God holds out before us". The goal of the Church is to help families- in fact, everyone-experience God's love and most importantly to know that they are welcome members of the Church. All this may require what the pope calls "new pastoral methods."
