THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

The feast day of the body and blood of Christ, 60 days after Easter celebrates the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the last supper; This feast brings us back to the central mystery of our faith-

God became Man- He took on human flesh and blood-the same is sacramentally present to us in the Holy Eucharist when we receive Holy communion at Mass.

At the last Supper- His last meal with his disciples His farewell, What did Jesus give us as a parting gift?

HIMSELF, "This is my Body which will be given up for you.. This is my blood, poured out for you", Do this in memory of me' Jesus showed that he never wants us to forget what we mean to him, and we should never forget what he did for us in terms of human pain and suffering by offering his life for us on Calvary. **"Greater love than this no one has than to lay down his life for his friends."** What he did at the last Supper and what he was to do the following day, Good Friday, are inextricably linked.

The Mass really means that God is with us forever. His love has found a way to remain with us, to be food and drink for us. His parting words, risen from the dead and about to ascend to His Father were:

'I am with you all days, until the end of the world.'

The Programme is as follows:

21 August 2018, a National Opening of WMOF2018, which will take place simultaneously in all the dioceses of Ireland.

22 to the 24th August, a three-day Congress. Each day will reflect on the theme "The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World" with adult and keynote speakers, workshops talks for all, as well as fund activities for children. It will also include daily celebration of the Eucharist, cultural events and musical performances.

Saturday 25th August 2018. A Festival of Families, comprising a reflective concert style event, in which personal stories of faith will be shared by families from all continents.
